What is the Engineering Leadership Minor/Certificate?

The minor and certificate provide a launching pad for a student's multiple career paths. The minor and certificate is a tangible way to demonstrate your commitment to excellence. When you complete the minor or certificate this will be on your official UCF transcript. Potential employers will see you have invested in yourself to be the best you can be.

How do I sign up for the Engineering Leadership Minor/Certificate?

To sign up for the Engineering Leadership Minor/Certificate you can take the following steps:

- 1) Double check the catalog year
 - Students will need to work from the 2014-2015 catalogue or newer
 - If you are operating under a catalogue before 2014-2015 you'll need to double check with your undergraduate advisor for potential changes to your program of study by joining the minor or certificate
- 2) Double check you are officially declared as an engineering or computer science student
 - You must be declared engineering or computer science student (successful completion of Calc I & II, Physics I and an acceptable Chemistry)
- 3) Sign up online
 - My.ucf.edu
 - Change Major: request
 - Add minor/certificate
