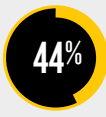
UCF at First Glance

CAREER PREPARATION

- More than 20,000 students gain practical experience through co-ops, internships and service-learning projects annually.
- UCF awarded 2,317 baccalaureate degrees in STEM fields in 2015-16.
- Career Services helped 35,286 students compete for jobs in 2016-17.

TOP VALUE EDUCATION

- 44 percent of UCF students graduate without educational debt. Nationally, only 34 percent of students graduate debt-free.

- UCF's six-year graduation rate is 70 percent, the third best among Florida's state universities.
